



English

In English this term, our focus text will be *The Viking Boy*, which links to our History topic, *The Vikings Are Coming*.

In class, the children will be learning about non-fiction texts and will write their own non-chronological reports, including headings and subheadings, conjunctions, and expanded noun phrases.

Towards the end of the term, the children will be writing persuasive letters, with a focus on rhetorical questions, emotive language, and paragraph structure.



RE

This term in Year 4, we will be learning about **The Gospel** and exploring our big question: *"What kind of world did Jesus want?"*

Children will learn the meanings of parables, including **The Good Samaritan**, and explore how Christians follow Jesus' teachings in their everyday lives and what this looks like in practice.

Maths

This term in Year 4, we will be finishing our unit on Multiplication and Division, including multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100.

We will then move on to Length and Perimeter, measuring and calculating the perimeter of different shapes.

Towards the end of the term, the children will begin their Fractions unit, learning about equivalent fractions, counting in hundredths, and finding fractions of amounts.

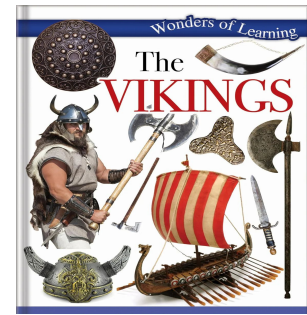
Learning Overview

PE

PE lessons will take place on **Mondays** and **Fridays**, and children should come to school wearing their PE kit on these days.

On Mondays, they will be taking part in Tag Rugby, learning skills such as ball handling, movement, and basic tactics.

On Fridays, Team Theme will be in school teaching Netball, with a focus on passing, attacking and defending, and footwork.



Connected Curriculum

Vikings are Coming

In History, we will be exploring the question: How did the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons impact Britain?

Children will learn about who the Vikings were and where they came from. They will discover how these people lived, how they travelled, and why they came to Britain.

We will also explore what the Vikings brought to Britain and how their ideas, skills, and settlements influenced life at the time.

Finally, children will learn about the legacy of the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons in modern Britain, including how they shaped towns, laws, and culture that still exist today.

Throughout the term, there will be opportunities to make cross-curricular links with the Vikings in Art and English, allowing children to explore their learning in creative ways.
