Locations and Places

 There are **7 continents**:  Africa,  Antarctica,  Asia,  Europe,  North America,  South America,  Australia. 

 There are **5 oceans**:  Pacific,  Atlantic,  Indian,  Southern,  Arctic.

 Places nearer the **equator** are hotter.

 Places further away from the equator are colder.

 The **UK** is in Europe.
