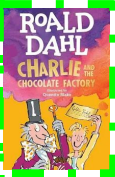


## English



This term in English, pupils will explore *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*, linking their reading to our geography topic "Bean to Bar."

They will develop their creative writing through composing limerick poems, focusing on key skills such as similes, alliteration, rhyme, and rhythm.

Children will also apply their understanding of the text by writing a newspaper report based on events from the chocolate factory, developing their use of formal language and key features of report writing.

## R.E

This term in Year 4, we will be learning about **Hinduism**.

Children will be exploring its key beliefs, practices, and festivals. They will discover the importance of gods and goddesses, and how Hindu people show their faith through rituals, puja, and celebrations like Diwali. Children will also reflect on Hindu values and how they guide daily life, while developing skills in asking questions, discussing beliefs respectfully, and making connections between their own experiences and those of others.

## Maths

This term, pupils will further develop their understanding of decimals by recognising tenths and relating them to fractions such as halves and quarters. They will learn to compare and order decimals, building confidence in identifying which values are greater and smaller. Children will also practise rounding decimals to the nearest whole number using number lines and their knowledge of place value. Later in the term, they will apply these skills in a money context, converting between pounds and pence. They will also estimate and calculate with money to solve real-life problems involving costs and change.

### **Learning Overview**

## PE

## Connected Curriculum

### Bean to Bar

In Geography, we will be exploring the question: How does Fair Trade help people and places around the world?

This term, pupils will explore the journey of chocolate in their "Bean to Bar" geography topic, learning where cocoa beans are grown and how they are turned into chocolate products. They will locate key countries on a world map and understand why cocoa is grown in hot, tropical climates near the Equator. Children will develop their understanding of global trade by following the journey of cocoa from farm to factory, and consider the importance of Fairtrade. They will compare different regions of the world, looking at physical features such as climate and human features such as farming. Throughout the unit, pupils will build key geographical skills including map reading, using atlases and interpreting information.
