Vocabulary:

Cocoa bean – the seed used to make chocolate.

Cocoa pod – fruit that contains cocoa beans.

Plantation – a large farm where crops like cocoa are grown.

Harvest – when crops are picked.

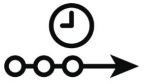
Fermentation – process that develops flavour in cocoa beans.

Trade – buying and selling goods.

Export – sending goods to another country.

Import – bringing goods into a country.

Fairtrade – a system ensuring farmers are paid fairly.

Ivory Coast – largest cocoa producer.

Brazil – grows cocoa in tropical areas.

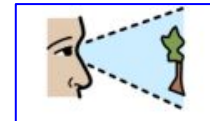
Indonesia – major cocoa producer.
