

English

This term in English, our class text, *Secrets of a Sun King*, will link with our Egyptian topic, *Journey to Ancient Egypt*.

Children will be writing their own autobiographies based on Tutankhamun, developing skills such as writing in the past tense, using different pronouns and time connectives, including factual information, and organising events in chronological order.

Towards the end of the term, children will be writing their own set of instructions for the mummification process, using imperative verbs, time conjunctions, adverbs, and adverbial phrases.

R.E

This term in Year 4, we will continue to learn about **Hinduism**.

Children will learn about Hindu stories and values, including Rama and Sita, and what these teach about dharma and karma. They will also study Mahatma Gandhi as a Hindu role model.

Children will explore what it is like to be a Hindu in Britain today, including traditions, daily life, and reasons for settling in Britain, and compare this with life in India.

Maths

In Maths this term, Year 4 children will be learning about shape and angles, statistics, and position and direction. They will explore the properties of 2D and 3D shapes, identify different types of angles, and investigate lines of symmetry.

Children will also interpret data using charts and graphs, use coordinates and directional language to describe movement and position, and continue to develop their reasoning and problem-solving skills.

Connected Curriculum

Journey to Ancient Egypt

In History, we will be exploring the question: What was life like in Ancient Egypt and why is it important?

This term, children will explore Ancient Egypt, starting with the importance of the River Nile and why it was vital for life and settlement. They will learn about Egyptian society, including pharaohs, priests, scribes, farmers, and slaves, and explore their roles and lifestyles.

Children will also find out about Egyptian beliefs and gods, and how religion influenced daily life, as well as investigating pyramids and why they were built. They will study aspects of daily life, including homes, food, clothing, and hieroglyphics.

Finally, they will learn about Egyptian inventions and how we know about Ancient Egypt today through artefacts and discoveries.
