Alexander the Great – King, expanded Greek culture

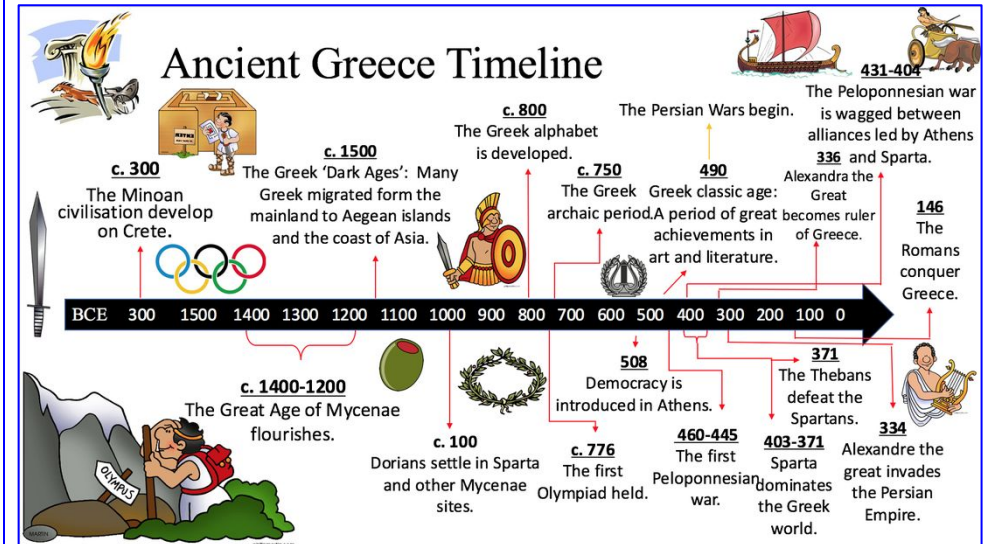
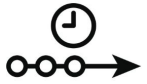
Socrates – Philosopher, questioned ideas
