Term 3 Home Learning Project

Your home learning challenge for the term is a project that will support your learning in school. To make the most of it, you have until the week of 25th February 2019 to bring in your work! If you need any help or information, please do not hesitate to ask. As always, make sure you continue to learn your times tables and spellings. You also need to read aloud. Remember to ask your listener to make a note in your reading record of how well you've done!

English/History

- Write a story, diary or play set in Roman times. Your characters could be in the Roman Army, gladiators, Celts living in Britain or people living in Pompeii. Try to use great vocabulary.
- Research Vesuvius (the volcano) and Pompeii (the city) and write an information text about what happened
- Create a tourist guide for Hadrian's Wall or other Roman site in Britain or in Italy
- Visit a Roman site in Kent (e.g. Canterbury Roman museum, Lullingstone Villa, Reculver or Richborough forts). What did you learn?

The Challenge

The Romans

Choose one or more of the activities do with the Romans.

Art / Design Technology (D.T.)

- Design and make Roman army equipment or a Roman vehicle. This could be a Roman costume, Roman armour, a Roman shield, a catapult, a boat, chariot etc.
- Draw or build a Roman monument (e.g. the Colosseum) or a Roman fort
- Find out what the Romans ate. Can you make some Roman food?

Maths

- Research Roman numerals. Can you write and solve some basic calculations?

Science

- Create a volcano. Can you make it erupt?
- Romans used armour to protect their bodies. Find out about the human skeleton, which also protects important organs. Can you draw it or print and label it?
- The Romans used sundials (shadow clocks) to tell the time. Can you make one and demonstrate how it works?

Geography

- Find out about Roman roads. Can you mark them on a map?
- Find out the Roman names for towns and cities in the U.K.

If you don't like any of these projects, design your own project that involves the Romans!
